MOE Subsidy

SCs and SPRs undergraduates pursuing part-time programmes who meet the following criteria are eligible for the MOE subsidy:

- Must not have previously received a government-subsidised/sponsorship for an
 undergraduate degree or higher qualification (local or overseas), from SUSS/NUS/
 NTU/SMU/SUTD/SIT or from an overseas university funded by government
 scholarship/bursary and
- Be at least 21 years of age;
- Have 2 years of full-time work experience <u>or</u> have fully discharge their full-time
 NS <u>or</u> currently employed on a full-time basis (excluding NS service)¹
