

# LAUNCH OF THE NEW REVIEW NOT REQUIRED (RNR) CATEGORY

To reduce the efforts required for obtaining ethics approvals, NTU-IRB is announcing the launch of the new **Review Not Required (RNR)** category.

PIs conducting **secondary research** on <u>anonymised datasets</u> or <u>anonymised Human Biological Material (HBM)</u> may now apply under the new **RNR Category** without needing to go through IRB review.


#### **SCOPE OF RNR CATEGORY**

The study team is conducting secondary research (i.e. no interaction or interventions with human subjects) and there will be no access to linkers to re-identify the subjects or attempts to re-contact the subjects.

The study team only has access to anonymized data or anonymized Human Biological Materials (HBM).

The study does not come under the HBRA, nor Restricted or Prohibited Human Biomedical Research, nor involve the use of **Human Tissues.**

certan studies will now be reviewed under a lower category. See below.

# Use of publicly-available data in identifiable form

Example
A study obtains publicly available data
(e.g. from social media sites) while
retaining the subjects' identifiers (e.g.
names, pictures) for secondary analysis

### Exempt Category 4

Study team only has access to anonymized data

Example
A study obtains student data from various
MOE schools for secondary analysis. The
data was effectively anonymised by the
schools before sending.
