CONTENT

The aim of this course is to teach relevant academic communication skills specifically related to the field of linguistics. In this course, students will learn how to read and write about linguistics research, and will have the opportunity to write up a short research report and to present research relevant to their discipline. The course materials have been designed in order to match the particular needs of Linguistics students at NTU.

LEARNING OBJECTIVES

The objectives of this course are to introduce Linguistics students to important aspects of academic communication, including:

1. gathering and critically evaluating relevant sources;
2. writing up a literature review;
3. presenting qualitative and quantitative data;
4. identifying and evaluating findings; and
5. completing a short research report.

LEARNING OUTCOMES

Upon successful completion of the course, students should be able to:

1. read and respond to academic texts in the field of linguistics;
2. gather and evaluate relevant academic sources;
3. write about qualitative and quantitative data; and
4. complete a short research report in the academic context.
